### Faith Confirmed

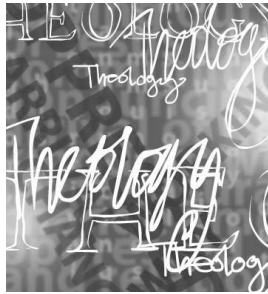
