SANCTUS AND BENEDICTUS

We remain standing as able as the priest continues the Great Thanksgiving:

All glory and thanksgiving be to thee, almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou of thy tender mercy didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who, by his own oblation of himself once offered, made a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memorial of that his precious death and sacrifice until his coming again.

For, in the night that he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,

Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you.

Do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying,

Drink ye all of this,
for this is my Blood of the new testament,
Which is shed for you and for many
for the remission of sins.

Do this as oft as ye shall drink it
in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of thy dearly beloved Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, we thy humble servants do celebrate and make here before thy divine Majesty, with these thy holy gifts, which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to

make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; rendering unto thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same, and looking for his coming again with power and great glory.

And we thine unworthy servants beseech thee, most merciful Father, to hear us, and to

✠ send thy Holy Spirit upon us

and upon these thy gifts and creatures

of bread and wine,

that, being blessed and hallowed

by his life-giving power,

they may become the Body and Blood

of thy most dearly beloved Son,

to the end that all who shall receive the same may be sanctified both in body and soul, and preserved unto everlasting life.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness, mercifully to accept this

our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving.

And here we humbly offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies,

to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice

unto thee, beseeching thee to accept this our

bounden duty and service, not weighing our

merits, but pardoning our offences, through

Jesus Christ our Lord:

by whom, and with whom,

in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

all honour and glory be unto thee,

O Father almighty, world without end. **Amen**

We now KNEEL to prepare for Holy

Communion.

As our Saviour Christ hath commanded and taught us, we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name;

thy kingdom come; thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation,

but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom,

the power, and the glory,

for ever and ever.

The priest says:

Deliver us, Lord, from every evil and grant us peace in our day; in your mercy keep us free from sin and protect us from all anxiety as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour Jesus Christ, who is Lord for ever and ever. **Amen.**

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

Though we are many, we are one body, for we all share in one bread.

HOLY COMMUNION

The following prayer may be said by all:

**We do not presume
to come to this thy holy table, O merciful
Lord,
trusting in our own righteousness,
but in thy manifold and great mercies.
We are not worthy
so much as to gather up the crumbs under
thy table.
But thou art the same Lord,
whose nature is always to have mercy.
Grant us therefore, gracious Lord,
so to eat the Flesh of thy dear Son Jesus
Christ,
and to drink his Blood,
that our sinful bodies may be made clean
by his most sacred Body,
and our souls washed
through his most precious Blood,
and that we may evermore dwell in him,
and he in us. Amen.**

Behold the Lamb of God,
behold him that taketh away the sins of the
world.

**Lord, I am not worthy,
that thou shouldest come under my roof,
but speak the word only, and my soul shall
be healed.**
