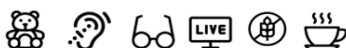

one God, world without end.

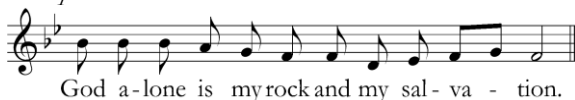
